

Outcome Measures

Outcome Measures are important to determine whether consumers of public mental health services in Victoria get better as a result of the services they receive.

Outcome Measurement is one way to improve our consumer focus by monitoring our clinical effectiveness.

Key things to remember

- 1. The National Outcomes and Casemix Collection (NOCC) requires public mental health services to collect Outcome Measures (OM) on admission, intake, every 91 days, and on discharge
- 2. OM will inform the funding model for public mental health services in Victoria
- OM should also be collected when there is a change in clinical presentation i.e. when there is a change in Phase of Care. The CMI will display these as 'Discretionary Reviews'
- 4. If 'Assessment Only' Phase of Care is assigned, collection of the full suite of outcome measures is not required
- 5. Inpatient admission episodes of 72 hours or less duration do not require discharge outcome measures
- 6. Community episodes of 14 days or less duration do not require discharge outcome measures

What should be collected and when?

Diagnosis

Diagnoses provide contextual information in understanding the OMs collected.

- Principal Diagnosis is the primary diagnosis allocated at the time of OM collection.
- Additional diagnoses are co-morbid conditions that affect the consumer's care at the time of OM collection.
